If GNU has lacked anything in the past, it is not talent or skill, but simply the ability to concentrate and focus real attainable goals. The fact that the chorus has been a consistent top 10 and frequent medalist chorus for 20 years demonstrates that we do lots of things right. But, there are certain things that have kept us from moving to the "next level."

Long-Term Thinking. We have been conditioned to think from contest to contest, chasing our tail, if you will, hoping that if we keep doing the same things over and over we would eventually win. I am guilty of shortsightedness as well. The 3-year plan is a real stretch for me. Lots of questions came to my mind. How will we stay motivated without a contest every 6 months? Will people quit without the short-term contest goal? What if, after 3 years, we're still in the same position we are in now?

The key to staying motivated is to know our long-term goals and measure them along the way. Let's look at just a few of our goals and see how we're doing?

**Goal 1:** 100 men on the risers consistently by Oct. 08. (Qualifying District for Anaheim)



### Progress:

- We have added 8 guest nights to our yearly calendar.
- Since Jan. over 50 guests have come to visit GNU rehearsals!!
- Jan 07 65 Men on the risers (start of the season)
- Mar. 07 (today) 73 Men on the risers (several more are close)
  - o Projections: June-79 men, Sept.-85, Dec.-91

Goal 2: Concert Season Increase/Repertoire Increase

### Progress:

- Successfully Added a 4<sup>th</sup> concert and Madison Mini-tour
- Have a plan for 10 new songs in 07
  - Debuted two new songs on Collegiate Show in March
  - Will debut two more on the Madison Show in April


### Goal 3: Compete for the GOLD!

- Securing coaching sessions



Music: How about our 3rd Annual Collegiate Concert. If you missed this performance at St Michaels, you missed a great concert. SO many highlights to list here, but I

Money: The final numbers are still being tabulated, but given our late start with selling Season Tickets, we've sold over 80 Season Passes. Not bad, slightly down from last year, but we are committed to get these started much earlier next year. Our "Raise The Roof" campaign will be between April and May...we look to continue our high

participation percentages of our active members.

**Marketing:** The marketing team is doing a great job getting information out about our Concert Season. If you can afford some "volunteer" time to help out, please contact Jared Hoke. There is always more marketing opportunities than there will ever be volunteers to do the work. 

## **Quartet News**

Pilgrim Point is a camp owned and operated by the United Church

of Christ denomination, and located on a point in Lake Ida, near Alexandria, MN. David was fortunate enough to attend Pilgrim Point with his family for a week in the summer 13 different times, and he and his family still have very strong ties with other families they met over those years. In 2006, David and Angela took Emma and Max to Pilgrim Point for the first time for a week in August.

The idea for the concert came during a discussion near the end of the week between David and Kris Potter, Mayflower Director of Ministries to Children & Families. After brainstorming about what the concert might look like, they decided to have *After Midnight* join with other Mayflower performers, and to direct all of the proceeds from the door donations to the new Pilgrim Point "Campership" fund.

Although the threatening weather (remember the warnings about the 8-12" we were hearing?) kept the crowd relatively small, over 50 people braved the elements, and made for a very energetic audience. Based on their reactions during each of our three sets, and the comments we heard afterwards, we felt like the concert was a real success. A few days after the concert we received the following note of thanks from Kris Potter:

2007 Land-O-Lakes District Quartet Top Gun School

January 12-14 was a cold blustery weekend in Menomonie, Wisconsin, but the LOL District's top quartets turned all that around with some extraordinarily hot singing. In addition to the district Chapter Officers Training School (COTS) that weekend, the LOL District and the LOL Association of District



Champions co-sponsored the LOL Quartet Top Gun School.



The Top Gun School is an invitation-only school matching eight of LOL's highest scoring quartets with four of the best

coaches in the Society. Its mission is to improve LOL's best competitive quartets, taking near-district champion quartets to championship levels and current district champions to even higher levels in international competition.

Attending the school were 2006 district champs Voices Only, 2005 district champs After Midnight, and 6 other top scoring quartets, including Bandwagon, Quarter Past Four, Geneva, Main Event, Wireless, and Escalade.

The scheduled faculty included four international champion quartet men, all of whom are in high demand for their superlative coaching skills: Jay Giallombardo, Tony DeRosa, Brandon Guyton, and Mike Slamka. The morning the school began, a last minute phone call from Tony DeRosa informed us that he had strep throat and could not come. Well known coach Brent Graham immediately agreed to take Tony's spot, and he filled it well.

Coaching sessions were with quartet pairs, so that each quartet got a dedicated coaching session for their quartet and a master class with their paired quartet from each of the four coaches. Quartet pairings changed every session, so each quartet got to see four different quartets in action in addition to their own coaching.

The improvement seen in a short day and a half was in many cases truly remarkable. Some quotes from the quartets include:

"We now know what to focus on in our rehearsals in order to get to "the next level"" – Voices Only

"Every single coach was able to pinpoint areas where we could improve the most AND they gave us great exercises to help us develop habits that stick." - Escalade

"We were excited to leave with new rehearsal techniques that could be applied in our weekly quartet practices." – Quarter Past Four

"What a great way to learn how to progress to the top level from those who have already done it!" – After Midnight

"Top Gun was a testament to LOL's mission of encouraging quartet singing in our district." – Bandwagon

As if the terrific coaching wasn't enough, the Top Gun quartets all came over to the COTS location Saturday night for a weekend ending afterglow, with each quartet showing off their skills to an appreciative audience of COTS attendees.


